1) **Plan your documentary**  
Write a script: Include background information such as the history and geography of the issue you are dealing with

2) **Video Tape and Edit**  
The Flip camera\* we provide you with, allows you to not only record your own digital story, it also comes with easy to use video editing software

3) **Send it in**  
Send a copy of your digital story to Tanya at Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots. We will share it on our website, with Roots & Shoots member across Canada and around the world, and more!

**\*"You're going to give us a video camera?"** Yes we will give you a camera to shoot your story and to use for future projects. We will also be available to support your group with technical and not-so-technical help when you need it. Is there a catch? A small one! All we ask is that you work together in your groups to create your own unique work of art!
